A BIG TANNERY FIRE.

THE PLANT OF HAN & CO., NEAR MANCHESTER, BURNED.

LOSS, \$30,000; Insurance, \$20,000.

Either Combustion or Carelessness of Employees Supposed to Have Been the Cause—Not Decided About Rebuilding—Other Items.

The large tannery and leather manufacturing plant of J. C. Han & Co., on the Richmond and Petersburg railroad, a short distance beyond the corporate limits of Manchester, was destroyed by fire last night. Only the warehouse was saved.

NO WATER NEAR BY.

One set of hose was sent out to the scene of the fire by the Manchester Fire Department, but the lack of water, and still worse, of a pump to force that available, made it of no use.

WILL PROBABLY REBUILD.

The plant has been in operation for about three years, and was pressed with work, having on hand orders for several months' ahead.

INTERCOLLEGIATE CONTESTS AT NEW LONDON, CONN.

CORNELL WINS AGAIN.

The American Stroke Established Beyond Reasonable Doubt as the Best—The Freshman Race Won by Yale—Attendance, 6,000.

NEW LONDON, CONN., June 23.—The great intercollegiate aquatic contests, which for months have been looked forward to by thousands of college youths and their friends, and for which this historic old whaling town made special preparations, took place to-day, and the results again place Cornell on the pedestal of fame as the champion university crew of America, while to the Freshmen of Yale belongs the honor of success in the triangular race with the youngsters of Harvard and Cornell.
