INDICT FOR BIGAMY.

MANCHESTER GRAND JURY BRING TRUE BILL AGAINST C. W. SWANN.

A SWANBORO' PASTOR RESIGNS.

Rev. W. R. Haight to Leave CLOPTON-Street Baptist Church—Overall Faculty Starts Up With 85 Girls Employed—Mr. Babcock to Lecture.

The grand jury of Manchester held an adjourned session yesterday morning, and brought in a true bill against Charles W. Swann, charged with bigamy. When the jury sat last Monday week ago Mrs. Martha I. Swann came before them and stated that Charles W. Swann, who was only partially divorced from her, had, several years ago, gone to North Carolina and married again, and was then living with Mrs. Swann, No. 2, very near her (Mrs. Swann, No. 1), and she asked that he be indicted for bigamy. Important witnesses were absent, and the jury continued the hearing until yesterday morning. Then, after an exhaustive hearing, a true bill was returned against Swann. The indictment charges him with marrying Isabella Brown while still the husband of Mrs. Swann, No. 1. The second marriage took place in Halifax, N. C., and the certificate of it, as well as of the first marriage, was produced in court. The second wife was a resident of Manchester before her marriage, and went on a visit to relatives in North Carolina. Mr. Swann followed her, and they were married, taking a certificate from the preacher in due form. They then came back to Manchester and have lived here ever since.

The trial will probably come off at the term of the court, and will be one of the most interesting heard in Manchester in a long time.

Mr. Swann is a millwright by trade, but of late has been doing carpenter's work and is a member of the Baptist church.

REV. W. R. HAIGHT RESIGNS.
Rev. W. R. Haight, pastor of CLOPTON-Street Baptist church, Swansboro', tendered his resignation as pastor of that church at a special meeting of the officers of the church, held Sunday morning after the service.

The letter from Mr. Haight which conveyed his decision to resign the leadership of the church was read amid profound silence, and then laid on the table until next Sunday, when probably the members will take up and make a recommendation to the church as to what Mr. Haight is a man a little beyond 40, is married, and has several children. He was united about four years ago, when he accepted the call to CLOPTON-Street church, as stated secretary of the Young Men's Christian Association, the position now held by Mr. W. Reginald Walker.
