
When the old gentleman came to see me the other day he brought a bag of scaly-barks, a string of partridges, some chickens, country sausage, and a coon-skin cap.

HE WAS AN INFANT PRODIGY.

A Pupil of Jozsefy--He is an Athlete as Well as Scholar and Artist--Can Also Play Poker--Practices Eight Hours Daily.
