

VOLUNTEER SERVICE.

COMMISSIONS ARE HARD TO GET IN WASHINGTON. A GOOD "PULL" IS NECESSARY. Captain Bossieux's Application--Securities of Post-Office Officials--H. E. Smith, of Suffolk, Appointed Census Supervisor--Personal Notes.

WASHINGTON, D. C., July 1--(Special.)--The semi-official and almost positive statements given out from the War Department to the effect that no commissions would be issued to others than those now in the volunteer service for the 10,000 men to reinforce Ois are, it is understood, being quietly disregarded. The object was to keep off a "scramble" for the places, and, if possible, to prevent certain Senators and Representatives from coming here to push the claims of their constituents. It has leaked out that favored senatorial and administrative applicants are being secretly looked for commissions in the increased army, Ohioans being in the lead. This is all being done in such a manner as to escape detection, and is one of the reasons for the stringent order establishing a censorship over the clerks and other employees of the War and Navy departments. No news can now be given out, except by the Secretary of War, Assistant Secretary, or Adjutant-General. This order, of course, also covers the appointments of the increased army, and no announcement will be made of such appointments until the entire quota is filled.

CAPTAIN BOSSIEUX'S APPLICATION. Captain Lamb, the energetic representative from the Metropolitan District, was here to-day, and went with Captain Frank Bossieux, an efficient and expert disciplinarian, who has seen service in Cuba, to interview Adjutant-General Corbin, and, if possible, to secure a commission for the latter. The Adjutant-General kindly said the measures approved of the War Department towards organizing the volunteer force above the 6,000 men authorized by Congress, but that something would be done very soon, and Captain Lamb would be applied of it in due time. Captain Bossieux's chances are sure, and the whole 10,000 men are called out, and in that event he may get a commission in the volunteer army until 1900.

SECURITIES OF POST-OFFICE OFFICIALS. The press dispatches to-day do not improve the Philippine outlook. Whatever has been received by the War Department relative to the proposed fix of General Arthur's force was not posted when the Manila dispatches usually are. The news in the papers was read with great concern by officials who are keeping a close watch on the situation. Many of them believe that in view of the censorship over everything before it is cabled, there is more significance to be attached to the news received this morning than appears on the surface.

HACARTHUR RESIGNED. "General MacArthur is really resigned," said one army officer. "He is acting wholly on the defensive and seemingly at a disadvantage. It is a mistaken idea that his line extends to San Francisco, and has been generally reported. He simply has a flying column, which is now, if reports are correct, cut off from Manila."

REPRESENTATIVE LAMB CALLED ON COLONEL ALLEN. The representative in charge of the Jones-River Improvement, who had had a very satisfactory interview with him in reference to the reports and surveys of the channel of the river, which he expected that the work on it will be commenced in the very near future.

THE POST-OFFICE SALARIES. He next visited the Post-Office Department, where he saw the Chief of the Salary and Allowance Division, and asked for information relative to the proposed increase of the post-office salaries. RAILROAD STOCKS.

REMARKABLE DEMAND FOR THEM IN YESTERDAY'S MARKET. UNUSUALLY LARGE EARNINGS. This is What Caused the Boom--Norfolk and Western Preferred Earnings Joys a Strong Showing--Early Weakness in Specialties.

NEW YORK, July 1--The remarkable demand for the standard railroad stocks continued as strong to-day, as it was yesterday, and spread to much the same extent. Pennsylvania took the foremost place, both in respect to activity and strength. The stock showed the largest gain at the opening, and held its leadership without change throughout the day, closing at the top level, 3 3/4 points above last night's price. Study of the May report of earnings was the primary cause of the strength of this stock, but there were other factors in circulation that the incursion of New York Central into New England was to be followed by a similar move on the part of the Pennsylvania. A lease of the New Haven road. The sustained strength of New York Central at its high level doubtless prompted some large buying of Pennsylvania already paying 1 per cent. more per annum in dividends than the New York Central, and selling at 10 per cent. under the latter.

EXTRAORDINARY RAILWAY EARNINGS. Extraordinary railroad earnings, reported from every section of the country, was the motive for the buying in that department of the stock market. The earnings were all in good demand, and gained a point or over on the half-day's trading. St. Paul led in point of activity, but Rock Island showed the largest gain in price. Burlington felt the effect of profit-taking on the publication of its May statement, showing an increase in the surplus for the month of \$160,000. The Union Pacific also enjoyed the benefit of its showing in the May statement, as did Norfolk and Western, preferred. The former rose over a point, and the latter about as much.

THE EARLY WEAKNESS IN SPECIALTIES. There was early weakness in the specialties on the opinion against the payment of dividends on Federal Street street-railway lines; but disclaimers of an intention to strike by labor and the decline in the raw sugar held the department, as did the strength of Anaconda. A settlement of the rate war, International Paper and American Smelting weakened sharply in the late transactions.
