DEWEY'S POLITICS.
HIS BEING A DEMOCRAT A SURPRISE TO MOST PEOPLE.

HANNA MAY RESIGN CHAIRMANSHIP.

It is Thought He Will Do So, on the Ground of Ill-Health—Large Surplus War Revenue—Why Continue Stamp Tax?

WASHINGTON, D. C., April 9.—(Special.)—Admiral Dewey's declaration that he always has been a Democrat will come as a surprise to most people, inasmuch as it has been understood for some time that he believed in Republican principles, at least, prior to his admiration for President Cleveland, and this impression was based upon statements made last year by members of the Dewey family, who asserted positively that he was a Republican. His emphatic statement yesterday that he always has been a Democrat, removes every vestige of doubt, if any still remained, upon the question whether or not he is aspiring to the Democratic presidential nomination. Moreover, his evasion of the query whether he would have voted for Bryan in 1896 is additional evidence that his candidacy has been promoted by Gold Democrats of the East.

Dewey said he had no intention of issuing some kind of statement in a few days, though he did not indicate what his character would be.

HANNA'S CHAIRMANSHIP.

With the approach of the Republican National Convention, the question whether or not Senator Hanna will be the chairman of the executive committee has been revived, and is being discussed by politicians of both parties. The Senator maintains the position that he took when the subject first came up, five or six months ago, that it would be indelicate and improper for him to indicate that he would either accept or decline a place that had not been tendered to him, and he continues to refuse to talk about the matter.

It would not surprise his intimate friends, however, if Mr. Hanna were not the chairman of the new committee which will be chosen in June. Without doubt he will be asked to take the place, and the chances seem to be now that he will be content to decline it, on the ground that considerations of health would not justify his performing the onerous duties with which he burdened himself in 1896. In the event that he does not accept the chairmanship, the Senator will perform his executive duties in the next presidential campaign, and divide his time between Cleveland, when he will devote some attention to his business, and the city in which the Republican headquarters are located. Who would succeed Mr. Hanna as chairman is a question to be determined in the future. It is said Henry C. Payne, of Wisconsin, the present vice-chairman of the committee, who has been discussed in this connection, would not be able to do the work on account of impaired health.

HAY-PAUNCEFOTE FACT.

Senator Davis, chairman of the Committee on Foreign Relations, has practically made up his mind not to call up the Hay-Pauncefote treaty again this session, because of the division of sentiment in the Senate on that point. He regards it as impossible for its original form to be ratified, either in its conditional form, or as the committee desires to amend it.

UNJUST TAXES.

"With \$156,000,000 on hand and unused, the government is still collecting not only taxes enough to pay all necessary expenses, but is exacting from the taxpayers millions of dollars every month in excess of all needs. This is true, even if we assume that the present military expenses will continue for years, there is every prospect that they will decrease, and no prospect of their increase.

"Under these circumstances why should not the harassing and oppressive stamp upon medical preparations, perfumery, &c., which is an enormous and oppressive burden upon a few manufacturers and upon all the druggists, be repealed?"

"The government does not need this money. Why, then, continue to single out a few men to bear burdens upon no other class of people?"
