

A TEN-DAYS' TRUCE. AGREEMENT SIGNED BY RIVAL ST. BY REPRESENTATIVES. NO INTERRUPTION OF TRAFFIC. Interesting Question Is, What Will Be the Ultimate Effect of the Present Litigation?--As to Surrender of Franchise to the City.

It is assumed that there will be no interruption of street railway traffic for ten days, no matter what may be the final outcome of the litigation commenced in the Federal Circuit Court Friday. The president of the Passenger and Power Company and the receiver of the Richmond and Manchester Railway Company signed a ten days' agreement yesterday which insures the status quo for that period. The agreement provides that in the meantime representatives of both interests will discuss what permanent arrangements shall obtain during the litigation.

The most interesting question in connection with the latest phase of the street railway situation concerns the ultimate effect the litigation will have upon the whole property and plans of the Passenger and Power Company. AS TO SURRENDER TO CITY. Attention was directed to the fact yesterday that the Passenger and Power Company is required to surrender at an early day the old franchises of that component of the Richmond and Manchester Railway Company. This franchise, according to the terms of the court's order, was yesterday delivered into the possession of the Receiver of the Richmond and Manchester Railway Company, and the Receiver should terminate in favor of the Passenger and Power Company. The Receiver, however, the fact that the road exists mainly outside of Richmond, and has but few rights within this city, is held by some to be a favorable thing for the Passenger and Power Company.

The present litigation verifies the prediction of far-seeing Councilmen that the street railway matter was bound to land in the courts. What the ultimate outcome may be cannot be foretold. It is a matter of course that the suit may lead to surprising and sweeping moves in the interesting game of rival financiers and promoters.

AN UNNECESSARY CALL. It was expected there would be a meeting of the Street Committee at 5 o'clock yesterday afternoon. Such a meeting, in fact, was called by Chairman Otway S. Allan on Friday afternoon, but it was declared off yesterday. The call was made on the instance of counsel for Receiver Selden, who is thought to have apprehended difficulties in the way of uninterrupted continuance of the service on his line. The Street Committee, however, is expected to meet on Friday.

ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT. There was a conference yesterday between President Patton and Receiver Selden, at which the call was discussed. The feature of the meeting was the prompt agreement of the former to all the suggestions of the latter, as the following agreement, signed by the two, will disclose.

1. It is agreed that for the next ten days the condition of the poles, wires and electrical equipments of the Richmond Passenger and Power Company in the city of Richmond and Manchester, and those of the Richmond and Manchester Railway Company in said cities shall remain as they are at present, except that the Receiver shall have the right to remove any poles, wires or electrical equipments on the streets of the city of Richmond, and on the streets of the city of Manchester, under such terms and compensations as were fixed in the award made several years ago by the old companies.
