DISCHARGE OF RECEIVER IN WEEK.

In the meantime, bondholders will Present their Holdings for Redemption—Case Further Argued in U. S. Court, Which Enters Order.

In the United States Circuit Court hearing was resumed yesterday on the petition for the discharge of the receiver of the Richmond and Manchester Railway Company.

THE COURT'S ORDER. The Court's order recites the mutual consent of the litigants to continue the motion until July 10th, and continues: "In the meantime, the complainants agree to present their bonds, mentioned in the bill, at Merchants' Trust Company, of New York, for redemption and payment at the rate of \$1,050, and accrued interest, for each of said bonds, and if said bonds are so presented and redeemed, or if the same be not presented, then in either case it is agreed by the parties that an order shall be made on July 10, 1900, discharging the receiver and restoring the property of the Richmond and Manchester Railway Company to the Richmond Passenger and Power Company."

THE ORDER PROVIDES FOR CONSIDERATION of the accounts of the receiver, in the event of his discharge, and for the allowance that shall be made for his services. It is expressly provided that the failure of the bondholders to present their holdings for redemption before July 10th shall not release the Merchants' Trust Company from its obligation to pay said bonds when presented at a later day.

THE DISPOSITION OF THE RECEIVERSHIP, it will be seen, depends on the presentation of the bonds for redemption. A representative of the Passenger and Power Company said to a Dispatch reporter yesterday evening: "The sum of \$200,000 is on deposit with the Merchants' Trust Company, New York, for the redemption of these bonds. The bonds will be paid instantly upon presentation. I understood to-day from an attorney of the bondholders that there will be no delay on the part of the bondholders, and that \$200,000 will be presented for redemption the latter part of this week. The remainder, \$200,000, may require a few days longer to be gotten in hand. Some of them are pledged as security."

JUSTICE JOHN SPIRITED AWAY.

'Squire Lonnie Graves Presides for Him—Clerk Gregory in Court. Justice John, who has been spirited away, has not returned, and 'Squire Graves was the presiding genius in the Police Court yesterday morning.

The case of Marshall S. Gregory was set for hearing yesterday morning, but it was decided to continue it until tomorrow morning. Gregory was until recently the chief clerk of the Lexington Hotel, and is charged with stealing \$500 in money from Mrs. A. D. Atkinson, proprietor of the hotel.

Another conspicuous case in the Police Court yesterday was that of P. E. Sharp (colored), charged with breaking into Baggage-Car No. 142, of the Chesapeake and Ohio road, and stealing a lot of brasses. The man was given a thorough hearing by the 'Squire, and was sent to the jail.

Andrew Hogan (colored) was before his honor on the charge of threatening to kill Mattie Hunt. He was fined \$5 and the costs.

Mattie had another narrow escape with her life, so says a charge against John Williams alias Norfolk, also colored. Williams it is alleged to have said that he was going to deprive the said Mattie of her corporeal existence, the hearing was continued until tomorrow, when the necessary witnesses will be present to tell the story of Williams' threat.

William Mahone was up for being drunk. He was fined \$1 and the costs. Ernest J. Layton and Bob McClintock indulged in a fight on the street. Each was fined \$2.50 and the costs.

Marcella Harris and Rosa Smith (colored) were applicants for mercy and justice of the peace. The 'Squire, however, were up for creating a disturbance in the house of Sarah Derbyshire. They, too, were fined \$2.50 each.

The case of George Thoms, the countryman charged with appropriating the money of his employer, Mr. Thomas Deane, was heard, and Thoms was exonerated. He was, of course, at once allowed to go free.

James Whitaker (colored) is the negro arrested on suspicion that he was the man who stabbed Conductor Dillon, of the Manchester car line, Sunday night. Whitaker will be held for ten days as a suspicious character.

Minnie Courtney created a good deal of disorder on the street. She was fined \$2.50 and the costs.

The remaining cases were not at all important.
