A COMPROMISE NOW.

THIS THE WORD REGARDING THE CHINESE SITUATION. RESPONSES TO THE CHINESE NOTE. They indicate that the Possibility of an International Clash Has Been Done Away With—Who Will Represent Us as Peace Envoy?

WASHINGTON, September 5.—Within the last twenty-four hours, the United States Government received from its representatives at foreign capitals much material information in regard to the Powers, position regarding the Russian proposal to evacuate Peking.

The exact nature of the responses is not made public by the State Department for there are yet some replies to be transmitted, and until all of them are in, the negotiations are considered in such an incomplete form that they will not be made public.

QUESTION OF PEACE ENVOYS. The satisfactory progress of the negotiations along these lines has directed attention to the personality of the envoys, who will likely represent the Powers and China in the final settlement.

LONDON, September 5.—Sir Chih Chen Lo Feng Luh, the Chinese Minister here, admits the correctness in a general sense of the cable message sent to him according to Shanghai advices.

It is understood that disturbances and outrages upon missionaries continue in some of the districts outside of Peking. It is believed here, possibly because of these reports, that the foreign ministers in Peking will enter an earnest objection to any withdrawal of troops.

CHINESE PEACE COMMISSION. In other diplomatic quarters a strong belief is expressed that the requisite compromise will be found by China's naming peace commissioners.

DEMANDS A RECOUNT. CHAMBER OF COMMERCE WILL PETITION THE COUNCIL. POLICE CENSUS ALMOST ASSURED. City Fathers Will Co-Operate in the Work—The Partial Recount, Made in 1890, Resulted in the Discovery of Over 5,000 Omissions.

As forecasted in yesterday's Dispatch, the Chamber of Commerce will petition the City Council to have a police census taken. The Council, judging from the members' general expressions of dissatisfaction with the government count, will almost certainly accede to the request and co-operate with the Chamber.

A PARTIAL RECOUNT. The Chamber then petitioned for some additional time, if not the full thirty days, with the result that the office was closed for six days, ending July 2d.
