LONG LIST OF SHARES SHOW LOSSES. Weakness Due to General Disquiet Over Coal Strike and Money Market Outlook—Wheat Advances Strongly—Provisions Lower.

NEW YORK, September 19.—Quite severe inroads were made on prices before trading had stopped on the stock exchange today, and an average level was established considerably lower than the low point touched on Monday morning.

The weakness was the more conspicuous as other stocks in the steel group were relatively steady up to a late hour.
