AFFAIRS IN NORTH CAROLINA.

Striking Machinists at Sea-Tyson in the Penitentiary - Crops.

RALEIGH, N. C., July 12. (Special.) - The striking machinists here are at sea. They do not know where they are, and they are waiting for their return.

They say they have as yet drawn no money from the union. Some of them say they are in the penitentiary, and that the strike has failed. Of course, the movement for ten hours' pay for nine hours' work is merely the precursor of another one for ten hours' pay for eight hours' work, since it is understood that the strikers are striving for.

This is no secret. It was expected that the penitentiary books would be in such shape by July 15th that statements could be made of the state of affairs up to January 1st, April 1st, and July 1st, but the Fusionist administration had things in such a tangle that an expert has been employed to straighten them up.

TYSON IN THE PENITENTIARY.

To-day W. J. Tyson, insurance swindler and bigamist, was taken from jail here to the penitentiary, to serve ten years.
