

STATUS OF TRADE.

BUSINESS CHECKED BY STORM.

This the Case Along the Atlantic Coast, and Some Interior Points Also Suffer from Unfavorable Weather—Consumptive Demand, However, Gives No Evidence of Abatement, and the Prices of Staple Commodities Tend Upward.

NEW YORK, February 21.—Messrs. R. C. Dun & Co.'s weekly review of trade to-morrow will say: Along the Atlantic coast business was generally checked by the storm, and some interior points also suffered from unfavorable weather, but the consumptive demand gives no evidence of abatement. Prices of perishable goods advanced sharply, and the prices of some commodities tending upward.

PIG-IRON ADVANCES. Prices of pig-iron have made decided advances, despite the opposition of local interests. Railway supplies and structural material are still the most eagerly sought of finished steel products.

Cotton added a small fraction to its price, and ruled quiet during the week, at the highest prices in the crop year. Stock market operations were only of fair size, and price changes were small.

FAILURE RECORD. Liabilities of commercial failures thus far reported for February aggregate \$6,987,881, of which \$3,494,627 were in manufacturing, \$2,822,142 in trading, and \$671,112 in other commercial lines.

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
