

HELD UP IN HENRICO

UNKNOWN NEGRO ORDERS WHITE MAN TO DELIVER.

BUT HE TOOK TO HIS HEELS.

Officers After the Negro—Proposed Bond Issue Dead—Excellent Progress in Public Schools of the County—Dawson is Fined.

A white man named Phaup was held up opposite the county school house, in Fulton, on Tuesday night, shortly before midnight. Phaup was on his way home when he was accosted by a ugly-looking negro, who ordered him to throw up his hands.

But for the fact that Squire J. P. Martin lives in the neighborhood, this bad condition would be much worse. He uses all of his energies to keep the unlawful element down, but with all of his efforts the conditions are still bad.

Unless the promoters of the bond issue for the improvement of the public roads in Henrico county, carry the matter to the higher court, the question is a dead one as far as the recent act of the General Assembly is concerned.

The act in question provides that the fund, if raised, should be expended by four commissioners, whose prerequisite for office is that they should be freeholders.

It is probable that the matter will be dropped now, but that it will be revived when new and constitutional authority can be secured from the Legislature for the company to issue bonds to raise funds to improve the roads.

The public schools of Henrico county are making excellent progress at this time and the work of the session, which will soon come to a close has been pre-eminently satisfactory to Superintendent Fussell and the trustees of the four ministerial districts of the county.

Charles Dawson, the white man who was charged with attempting to commit an assault on Mrs. Ella E. Jordan, at her home in Fulton on Monday afternoon, was given a preliminary hearing before Squire Martin yesterday and fined \$25 for disorderly conduct.

John Kahn, a white man who is charged with disorderly conduct at the Cedar-Works and with resisting Constable Cushing, will be given a hearing this morning at 11 o'clock before Squire G. W. Thomas.

Granville Neal and F. F. O'Conner have posted notices at the county court-house declaring that they will apply for licenses for the retail of liquor. They propose to operate at No. 88 and No. 95 Graham street in Fulton.

The Henrico County Court adjourned yesterday for the term after a fourteen days' term.

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THE DEFENSE RESTS IN SMITH COURT-MARTIAL. Testimony That Lucban Ordered That Natives' Spears Be Poisoned.

MANILA, April 30.—Lieutenant George H. Shields, Jr., aide-de-camp of General Jacob H. Smith, testified at today's session of the court-martial who is trying the General. The Lieutenant said he knew well the signature of Lucban, the insurgent leader who was captured February 23d, by Lieutenant Streblor's Philippine scouts, in the island of Samar.

WASHINGTON, April 30.—A cablegram received from Manila, regarding the capture of Admiral Rodgers, the commander-in-chief of the United States forces on the Asiatic station, and the capture of the German warships were bombarding Vigan, and the Filipino navy was blockading Manila, which was issued to encourage the natives.

WASHINGTON, D. C., April 30.—The first legislative step looking to the establishment of diplomatic relations between the United States and Cuba, was taken today by the Senate Committee on Foreign Relations. The committee took up the subject of Cuban independence, and recommended an amendment to the sundry civil appropriation bill, providing the necessary funds for the proper representation of this country in Cuba.
