

THE INTERNATIONAL SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSON FOR SEPTEMBER 28. STUDIES IN THE OLD TESTAMENT. REVIEW.

GOLDEN TEXT: "Thou shalt remember the Lord thy God." Deuteronomy viii, 18. "God of our fathers, known of old, Lord of our far-flung battle line, Whom heaven's entire armor hangs around, Dominion over palm and pine— Lord God of hosts, be with us yet, Lest we forget—lest we forget!"

A GREAT HISTORICAL MOVEMENT. We have been studying one of the great world-affecting movements of universal history for the last three months. We have traced the movement as it is found in the books of Exodus, Numbers, Leviticus, and Deuteronomy. They deal with the origin of the Hebrew people as a nation. No one can gainsay the fact that this nation has played a very important part in the history of the world.

It would be interesting for a purely ethnological standpoint, even if we had no interest in the religious aspect of it, to try to discover the origin and rise of this remarkable people upon the stage of the world's history. We have been studying ancient history. The early rise of many nations is enveloped in a legend. But the Hebrews are the only people who have an authentic and provable history. Above the mists of tradition in which the origins of the Hebrew nation are enveloped, two historical facts stand out prominently. One is the exodus from the land of Egypt and the wanderings of the tribes in the steppes of Asia.
