

A DEBATE PROMISED

FLOOD AND LYONS TO MEET AT MONTEREY ON COURT-DAY.

A NOVEL WEDDING INDEED.

Amphibious Attacks and Pauper Marry-The Drought Broken at Last-Pinecky Waybright Accidentally Shoots Himself With a Rifle-Highland Court Notes.

MONTEREY, Va., October 11.—(Special.)—It has been definitely arranged, by the parties themselves, to have a joint discussion between Messrs. Flood and Lyons, the opposing candidates for Congress in the Tenth District, at Monterey, October 23, County Court day. It is safe to say that this announcement, made in good time, will draw a large crowd, because, in this country, where the settlement is equally divided, a joint debate is a growing card, and the two candidates could not have hit upon a better plan to interest the voters of the county.

The breaking up of the drought, some weeks ago, and the subsequent showing of sunshine, and warm nights, have brought a transformation that, one must be in order to appreciate. The pastures and meadows, two weeks ago so bare and brown, that not a green blade of grass could be seen, are now showing a beautiful coat of green, and the erstwhile lowing, bleating herds, wandering about for grass and water, now have them in abundance, and the forest hills are especially needed in the season of limited harvests—is quite promising, both in point of progress and weather conditions.

During the week two weddings have occurred in this community. On Thursday morning, especially noted, a young man and woman, were met by Rev. H. A. Merrill, of Crabottom, after which Miss Mary E. Holt and Mr. Chapman Pittsenger, of Doe Hill, were made man and wife, the ceremony being performed in the parlor of the Star Hotel.

A NOVEL WEDDING, INDEED.

Connected with the other marriage were some very unique features. The bride and groom, Ouis and Ella Simmons, attached to Monterey, respectively, of the district, were married in the morning, the man carrying a heavy telescope, and the girl a 6-months-old baby, and applied to Captain Mathew for the necessary papers. These were finally sent out, and the hands of the couple proceeded to Ashbury Chapel, one mile north of town, where Rev. H. D. Hironimus is conducting a holiness meeting. At a convenient interval, some accommodating friends called upon the minister, giving the consideration of the ordinance, giving the right to T. F. OFFICIAL ESTIMATES FOR NORFOLK NAVY-YARD

Water System at Fort Norfolk.

A GREAT BIG BOER.

Washington, D. C., October 11.—(Special.)—The navy-yard at Norfolk is one of the principal points provided for in Secretary Moody's estimates for the year ending June 30, 1904, to be submitted to Congress. Nearly the entire amount is for things not included in the appropriation in the last report from the Navy Department, \$75,000 is for a continuation of the work of fitting out a basin by quay walls, \$5,000 for the extension of the railroad track, and \$5,000 for the work upon the electrical system for the dry docks.
