

HILL IS EXCORIATED.

Governor Odell Makes a Bitter Attack on the Ex-Senator.

NEW YORK, October 22.—The State political campaign assumed a bitter aspect today through the endorsement given by ex-Senator Hill of allegations published in a Schenectady paper that Governor Odell was interested in business interests that were profiting by State contracts. The allegations were repeated tonight by Senator Hill in his speech at the Tammany Hall ratification meeting.

Mr. Hill said: "It now appears that the State made last winter by the administration, was not only pecuniary but mercenary in its character. Its real purpose was not merely to secure complete control of all the official positions to be had in the various charitable institutions, but to control the purchase of supplies therein."

Governor Odell, speaking to-night at a general and refutation of the charges. He said that when he was elected Governor he had no relations with contractors, State contracts, and that he had conscientiously refrained from saying or doing anything that might be construed as tending to help his former business associates.

The Governor also reviewed and denounced the political career of Mr. Hill, and concluded with a bitter personal attack upon the ex-Senator, to whom he alluded as "a man who has never known the love of an innocent child in his arms, and who would sacrifice his best friends to his ambitions."

TWELVE ARE MISSING.

That Number Supposed to Have Perished in the Chicago Fire.

CHICAGO, Ill., October 22.—Four of the bodies taken to the morgue from the ruins of the plant of the Glucose Sugar Refining Company last night, have been identified. It is almost certain that several more bodies are lying in the ruins, and the heat of the fire has prevented them from making any search to-day, and the exact number is not known.

FIERCE FLAMES IN BUFFALO.

Freight Sheds of the Union Steamboat Company Burnt Yesterday.

BUFFALO, N. Y., October 22.—Fire tonight destroyed the freight sheds of the Union Steamboat Company, on the Michigan street, near the foot of Michigan street. One of the big Lehigh Valley freights, which was unloading grain at the Marine elevator, directly opposite the sheds, was pulled away from the sheds with her upper-works ablaze, and it was with great difficulty that other vessels succeeded in escaping the flames which swept down across the slip and to the opposite side of the Buffalo river. A downpour of rain which began about 10 o'clock, probably prevented a disastrous conflagration along the water front. The total loss is estimated at \$3,000.

FIRE DESTROYS TEPEE HOTEL.

Escape by the Stairway Cut Off—One Body Removed from Ruins.

SPOKANE, WASH., October 22.—A special says that the Tepee Hotel, at Fairview, B. C., was destroyed by fire early to-day. One body has been taken from the ruins and seven other persons are said to be fatally injured.

The fire started near the furnace room, and the flames shooting up the stairway quickly cut off escape, except through the windows. The guests on the first floor escaped easily, but many of those above were badly hurt, either by the flames or by leaping to the ground. The body of a school teacher was taken from the ruins this morning.

Mrs. Mathis, wife of a bar tender, leaped from a second-story window with her baby in her arms. The baby is safe, but the woman will die. Mathis and James Allen, the engineer, were probably fatally hurt. John Long, a druggist, was badly burned. Four others, names unknown, are reported to be fatally injured.
