BLACKBERRY CROP WILL BE LARGE. Forty Steamers Ready to Pounce Upon the Bunker Fish in the Bay.

(Special to The Times-Dispatch.) HEATHSVILLE, Va., May 9.—From the amount of blossoms that now adorn the blackberry bushes of the public highways and hedgerows, the crop of that fruit will be both heavy and large. Every acre and every vacant spot along the fence rows is filled with the beautiful and familiar white blossom, until the whole of the county is clothed in a rich garland of beauty, full of the promise of the bumper crop of the future.

Since the closing of the oyster season the last of April, the men who followed oystering for a living have engaged in the crabbing business and large quantities of crabs have been captured during the past two weeks and prices have fallen considerably of late. In some instances exceedingly low figures have been realized. The fishing fleet of steamers, and forty in number will start out in full blast to pounce upon the bunker in the course of the next few days, as most of the factories have made all preparations for the opening of the season. It is said that the "fishwives" are showing up in large numbers in some places.

Numbers of fish-packing houses have been built this season in the Northern Neck and many thousands of choice Potomac herring have been packed during the last month. The packers have had a very good season and the fish and many private residences are being wired for the use of electric lights.
