NEWPORT NEWS, Va., June 24.—The Central Labor Union will on Friday night take up the serious question of organizing the negro mechanics and workmen in the city and permit them to affiliate with the central body. A number of the labor leaders have come to the conclusion that to take this step means the only solution of the labor problem in Newport News.


