

WILCOX IN BRICK-YARD Three Notable Prisoners Al Working Together. JOINS SUNDAY-SCHOOL

Large Enrollment at the Summer School of the Agricultural and Mechanical College—New Charters Granted—St. Mary's School.

(Special to The Times-Dispatch.) RALEIGH, N. C., July 2.—All three of the most notable convicts in the State penitentiary—James Wilcox, murderer of Nellie Crook, Ed. Utley, who shot the hotel clerk at Fay Station, and Bishop, the assassin of Mrs. Wilson, in Charlotte are working in the brick yard and making model prisoners.

Last Sunday James Wilcox joined a Sunday-school day and seemed attentive and interested in Bible study. Utley and Bishop, however, decline thus far to have anything to do with the Sunday-school.

SUMMER SCHOOL. The management of the summer school at the Agricultural and Mechanical College are much gratified at the very large enrollment, there being upwards of 300 already here and many more to arrive between this and Monday. To-night there was a reception by the summer school faculty to the teachers who have registered for attendance. While this is only the second day of the school routine work is already well under way.

THE TREATY CELEBRATE IS SIGNED THE FOURTH

Isle of Pines Wholly Under Cuban Sovereignty. This Is What Every Richmonder Will Do To-Morrow.

COALING STATIONS FOR US DEEP SHADE; COOL WAVE Occupation of Them Will Be Perpetual and the Rental Merely Nominal. Other Treaties Will Soon Be Ratified.

(By Associated Press.) HAVANA, July 2.—The treaty covering the naval and coaling stations and the treaty placing the Isle of Pines wholly under Cuban sovereignty were signed to-day at noon.

The Isle of Pines treaty was signed last week. Turning over the island to the absolute sovereignty of Cuba, the treaty safeguards the rights and privileges of the American residents on the island as though they were on American territory. Property and judicial and educational rights are especially guaranteed, as well as the conveniences for reference to the Cuban Government.

Other public business. It is pointed out that the American landholders are better off in respect to taxation than they would be under the United States sovereignty. There were practically no difficulties or delays in reaching an agreement on the subject of the Isle of Pines treaty, but the naval stations lease was the subject of long and tedious negotiation.
