

RAILROAD TAXES AND

Atlantic Coast Line Swells the State Treasury.

DRAW ON THE LOAN FUND

Money to Improve and Build Public School Houses—Supreme Court to Open Monday—Wedding Cards.

(Special to The Times-Dispatch.) RALEIGH, N. C., August 27.—The Atlantic Coast Line Railroad Company today paid into the State treasury \$59,942.30, the amount of their State and pension taxes under the new tax valuation by the Corporation Commission. The Coast Line is the second road to pay taxes for this year.

The first batch of warrants on the State treasury for money from the loan fund to improve and build public schoolhouses were drawn today, the amount being \$11,856. The counties receiving these loans are Alamance, \$7,200; Cleveland, \$900; Warren, \$350; Gaston, \$3,000.

NEW LIBRARIES. Warrants for six new school libraries in Mecklenburg county were issued today, the amounts being for \$40 each. There was also a warrant for one library in Green county.

Dr. Thomas L. SAD DOWNFALL OF A YOUNG WOMAN

(Special to The Times-Dispatch.) HALLSBURY, N. C., August 27.—The sequel to the downfall of a handsome young lady in China Grove county, who went to Charlotte and was betrayed by a young married man, is the wreck of a home in Salisbury. The story is a long and pitiable one. Briefly, Miss Beulah Wilhelm, hitherto a respectable young woman, left her home in China Grove, and in company with her aunt, Mrs. W. L. Litaker, of Salisbury, went to Charlotte last week. The two women by some means became separated from each other, and Miss Wilhelm, left penniless and without friends, wandered aimlessly about the streets.

Her sad story revealed the fact that she had slept in a woodshed for three nights, and that her downfall was caused by a young married man. This man has since been arrested, and the crying and wailing of Mrs. Litaker's conduct is said to have been decidedly unbecoming, having left her home in Salisbury without the knowledge of her husband, who, upon his return from work at night, found the little daughter of his dead, but because her mother, she said, had not been there since early morning.

Mr. Litaker is instituting suit for divorce on the grounds of abandonment. The young woman in the case has been sent back to her home at China Grove.

MISS BROWNING DEAD

Never Recovered from Effects of Terrible Experience at Wrightsville. (Special to The Times-Dispatch.) GOLDSBORO, N. C., August 27.—Miss Louise Browning, one of two sisters known to the theatrical world as the Browning sisters, was found dead in a narrow canoe from Wrightsville Sunday morning. She was carried to the Emergency Hospital in this city in a serious condition. After the accident at Wrightsville Sunday afternoon, the two sisters took the train Sunday night and started for their home in New York. The following day this city Miss Louise was very ill and they decided to get off and spend the night here and leave for New York the following morning. At that time Miss Louise was no better and she decided to remain at the Bridgers' house and let her sister go on a New York train. She carried more than she could handle and yesterday afternoon she was taken to the Emergency Hospital, where she received every attention that could be given. Her commanding, Dr. M. E. Robinson, the physician in attendance considered her condition so serious, her mind was not clear and she was unable to arrive in the city to-morrow morning. The young woman grew rapidly worse later in the day and died at 7 o'clock this evening.
