CITY LOCAL OPTION TOO

And a Practical Extension of the Mann Law to All Communities.

THE WORK OF THE LEAGUE

Will Make Vigorous Campaign and Urge People to Send Temperance Legislatures Here.

At a meeting held in this city yesterday afternoon, the executive committee of the Anti-Saloon League laid its plans for a careful and thorough campaign of the State that is designed to control the membership of the next Legislature for the temperance cause in general and for two specific aims in particular.

The practical extension of the Mann law to towns and cities.

The enactment of a measure prohibiting ward local option or prohibition in cities in the same manner that district local option is allowed in counties.

Both of these projected movements are steps along the general direction to be followed by the league in its battle against the saloon in Virginia.

Lengthy discussion was given to these general plans yesterday, and the policy of the body for the coming two or three years was outlined.

As brought out in the consideration of this matter, the league considers it a duty of a State-wide association to take the initiative in the prohibition law.

Its energies will be directed against the saloon, and the State to-day grants licenses to saloons unless objection is raised by the citizenship of the community.

The league would reverse this order and provide that no license shall be granted until certain conditions are complied with.

Under a petition, an election would be held and the majority of the people voted against the saloon there would, of course, be no license granted.

But if the majority declared in favor of the saloon, then the State might, in its discretion, issue a license to a proper person for a saloon, to be conducted in a proper place.

Present Order Reversed.

This is to be the broad general platform of the league—a platform which reverses the present order of things, but which is radically different from State prohibition.

It means simply prohibition where the sentiment demands it, and where the sentiment is the ultimate object in view, the league will press on, accomplishing a step here and a step there, until the end is reached.

The fight now contemplated will not be made on this ultimate question, but upon the two specific points to be indicated above.

During the summer and the fall and the summer of next year the league will visit every county in the State, attending religious meetings and holding picnics, rallies and conventions of its own.

It will send speakers into every field and territory. The people everywhere will be urged to elect the next Legislature only such men as will comply with the league and declare that they are in favor of the restriction of the saloon along sensible, practical lines.

A number of other interesting matters were discussed at the session yesterday. The situation in the State was declared to be encouraging.

It was learned that the league will take no part in the gubernatorial fight, but individuals composing it will, however, cast their ballot for Judge Mann.
