Curious Situation at Virginia Building at World's Fair.

Geneological Chart of Thomas Jefferson Has Arrived—A Quartette of Soldiers.

(Special to The Times-Dispatch.) WORLD'S FAIR GROUND, ST. LOUIS, July 25.—Commencing today Mrs. Hilliard Russell and Miss Louise McCarthy, of Richmond, Va., began to serve as assistant hostesses of the Virginia State building for one week.

Concerning the failure of the regularly appointed assistant hostesses to appear, a St. Louis paper of recent date says: "The Virginia building at the World's Fair occupies the unique position among the State buildings of being the only one which has assistant hostesses who do not come to St. Louis to fill the duties of their positions."

The Virginia assistant hostesses hold honorary positions. Each one is appointed by one of the chapters of the Daughters of the American Revolution of Virginia, and despite the schedule arranged by Mrs. Strother, will not come to the Exposition until the warm weather is over.

The geneological chart of Thomas Jefferson and the Jefferson coat-of-arms were received at the Virginia State building a few days ago from Mrs. Saline Robbins, secretary of the Virginia Historical Society.
