ON TRIAL FOR HER MURDER

Sellers and Wood Being Tried at Wilmington for Killing Mrs. George Packer.

SKULL HAD BEEN CRUSHED

Her Throat Also Gashed and Evidence of Another Crime. Many Witnesses.

(Special to The Times-Dispatch.) WILMINGTON, N. C., October 12.—

The trial of Sellers and Brown, charged with the criminal assault upon and the murder of Mrs. George Packer, near Clarkton, on September 3d, was begun this morning. Five hours were consumed in drawing the jury.

Nineteen witnesses were sworn for the State. Two of them testified before court adjourned. Dr. George L. Clark testified as to the condition of the murdered woman's body. The skull was crushed and several gashes were made in the throat. The body was bruised all over. There were strong signs of another crime in the person.

A. C. Johnson, the other witness, testified as to the signs of a terrible struggle. The shoes worn by Sellers fitted the tracks and his shirt was stained with blood.

All the evidence will probably be concluded to-morrow. The courthouse was crowded to-day, but few people remain in town to-night and everything is quiet.

BIG SALE OF BONDS BY THE N. & W. CO.

Five Million Dollars to be Spent in the General Improvement of the System.

(By Associated Press.) ROANOKE, VA., October 13.—The annual meeting of the stockholders of the Norfolk and Western Railway Company was held to-day in the general offices of the company in this city. Henry Fink, chairman of the board of directors, presided at the meeting, and 83 per cent. of the entire stock of the road was represented. The old board was re-elected, and the report of the same was approved.

At a subsequent meeting of the board of directors, Lucius E. Johnson was re-elected president and general manager, and Henry Fink chairman of the board of directors. All other general officers of the company were re-elected.

The following announcement was made: "The Norfolk and Western Railway Company announces the sale to Messrs. Brown Brothers and Company, of New York, of \$5,000,000 divisional first lien and general mortgage bonds. The proceeds from these bonds will be used in vigorous prosecution of the work heretofore authorized, upon construction, second track, yards, replacement of bridges and for new equipment, reference to which was made in the last annual report."

The directors left on a special train for Cincinnati and other points along the line of the road.
