A JAIL SENTENCE FOR U. S. VETERAN

Will Lose His Right to Asylum in the Soldiers' Home.

VISIT FROM CONGRESSMEN

Friends of Maynard and Advocates of Jamestown—Marine Suit in Chancery.

(Special to The Times-Dispatch.) NORFOLK, VA., Jan. 19.—Frederick G. Kingsley, former inmate of the Soldiers' Home at Hampton, who has killed Captain Augustus Paul last fall in self-defense, was sentenced in the United States Court yesterday to sixty days' confinement in the Norfolk city jail.

Kingsley was tried on November 14th and 15th, and found guilty of manslaughter. Although his conviction will not affect Kingsley's pension as a Civil War veteran, it will deprive him of the right of asylum in the Home, unless influence can be brought to bear to have him reinstated.
