MONEY FOR SOUTH DAKOTA BONDS

Bill Passes House and Will Go at Once to Senate.

WILL BE FINAL BUSINESS

To Make the State Insane Asylums Fire-Proof.

(Special to The Times-Dispatch.)

RALPHIGH, N. C., March 3.—The bill authorizing the issuance of \$20,000,000 bonds for the settlement of the South Dakota bond judgment and the Shafter Bros. bonds passed the House of the North Carolina Legislature to-day on its final reading and was sent to the Senate without engrossment, so that it can get through its final reading in the Senate Monday, it being that last business that will engage the attention of the Assembly and adjournment will follow as soon as the House is passed and ratified.

NOTEWORTHY BILLS.

Noteworthy bills passed by the House to-day were: to establish the Geological and Economic Survey, appropriating \$10,000,000; appropriate \$100,000 for the construction of fireproof walls in the several State hospitals for the insane. The Senate bill from the Senate providing for the more prompt delivery of mail, Senate bill making it a misdemeanor to deface any monument. The House voted down the Senate bill to prohibit the shipment of liquor into prohibition territory to the persons under prohibition.

STEAMER AFIRE.

Crew Escaped, But Vessel and Cargo Were Damaged.

(Special to The Times-Dispatch.) NEW YORK, N. Y., March 3.—The steamer Columbia, owned by the Garter Packet Company, was partially destroyed by fire to-day soon after arriving from Monroe. Besides considerable miscellaneous freight, the steamer carried 183 bales of cotton, valued at \$25,000. Much of the cotton was saved although in a damaged condition. It was insured for about \$33 a bale. The steamer was uninsured.
