Unable, However, to Make Much Progress in Direction of Moving Prices.

STOCKS RISE LATE IN DAY

Temporary Curtailment of Resources Restricts Speculation—Closing Irregular.

(By Associated Press.) NEW YORK, March 31.—The stock market today was in the hands of professional traders and they made little progress in moving prices. Only a handful of the standard market leaders were as much as a point away from last night's closing.

The comparative tranquility of the call loan rate which did not get above 4-1/2 per cent. calmed apprehension and prices improved late in the day. Outside of the professional circle, however, there was no striking of speculative interest.
