HAY NOT TO STAND FOR RE-ELECTION

Virginia Will Not Try for Chairmanship of Democratic Conference Again. REVENUE OFFICE LOCATION Shaw and Yerkes to Take Up Alexandria Matter Next Friday.

(From Our Regular Correspondent.) WASHINGTON, D. C., September 12.—Commissioner Yerkes determined to settle as soon as possible the question of the removal of the office of the collector of internal revenue from Alexandria.

He notified Senator Daniel, Representatives Glass and Rixey and Collector Summers to-day that he and Secretary Shaw would hear them at 9 A. M. at 1 o'clock concerning the proposition to make a change in the location of the offices.

It is well known that Collector Summers wants the office removed to Abingdon, his home. Mr. Rixey wants it to remain at Alexandria, in his district, and Mr. Glass will try to have it located at Lynchburg.

It is understood that Senator Daniel will endeavor to have the office come to Lynchburg in case it is decided to remove it from Alexandria.

The question of location is decided finally by the Secretary of the Treasury, but, of course, the views of the commissioner of internal revenue have great weight.

Mr. Yerkes said to-day that it was the desire of the department to have the office of the collector located at a point in the collection district which is most convenient to the business men who have dealings with the collector.
