

## TO BURY WHEELER AT ARLINGTON

The Interment to Be Made in the National Cemetery With Full Military Honors.

**FUNERAL IN NEW YORK**  
 Services at St. Thomas's Church On Sunday, and Others in Washington.

(By Associated Press.)  
 WASHINGTON, D. C., January 25.—General Joseph Wheeler, whose death occurred in New York yesterday, will be buried in the National Cemetery at Arlington, with full military honors due an officer of his rank—brigadier-general of the United States army.

A plot has been selected on the slope to the right of the historic Arlington House, where his body will finally be placed at rest.

The tentative programme provides that the funeral services will be held at St. John's Church in this city, Monday afternoon.

The escort to be provided will consist of troops from all branches of the service.

 NEW YORK, January 25.—Funeral services for Brigadier-General Joseph Wheeler, who died yesterday at his sister's residence in Brooklyn, will be held in New York Sunday at the St. Thomas Episcopal Church, Rev.
