WESTMINSTER BRIDGE.
No. 746.
By WILLIAM WORDSWORTH.
Wordsworth says that this sonnet was written on the roof of a coach while he was on his way to France. He gives the date of the composition as September 3, 1802. According to his sister's diary, however, the date should be July 21, 1802. The following is the entry in the diary: "Left London between 5 and 6 o'clock of the morning outside the Dover coach. A beautiful morning. The city, St. Paul's, with the river—a multitude of little boats—made a beautiful sight as we crossed Westminster Bridge; the houses not overhung by their clouds of smoke were spread out endlessly; yet the sun shone so brightly, with such a pure light, that there was something like the purity of one of nature's own grand spectacles."
