Even the Special Stocks Failed to Furnish Market With Usual Support.

MONEY RATES ARE ADVANCING

Rise Regarded As Effective Check to Any Animation in the Speculation.

Even the special stocks which had been held by the continued mystery regarding alleged important developments expected concerning them were less aggressively sustained to-day, leaving the market without their supporting effect.
