GREENE-GAYNOR TRIAL RESUMED Defense Attempts to Prove the Prisoners Only Received Fair Compensation. COST WAS NOT EXORBITANT Civil Engineer Ripley Regards Work As Sound and Satisfactory.

(By Associated Press.) SAVANNAH, GA., March 21.—The testimony in the Greene and Gaynor trial to-day was a continuation of that relating to the relative cost of the work done by the defendants and that done by other contractors at many ports of the South Atlantic and Gulf coasts.

Cost Not Exorbitant. R. A. Blanford gave evidence intended to prove that the cost to the government of the work done by Greene and Gaynor under the Carter administration was not exorbitant and would successfully stand comparison with that done at the thirty-one other cities and towns from which reports were made.

Work Satisfactory. H. C. Ripley, civil engineer, of Galveston, Texas, one of the board of engineers who examined the work done by Greene and Gaynor, said there was little chance for any one to have manipulated the tide gauge, and thus falsify the work of inspection.

NOT TO SELECT CITY NURSERY Move to Take It for the State Fair Site is Not a Popular One. COLONEL CUTSHAW'S VIEWS Would Be Unwise to Destroy Valuable Property and Break Up Fine Park Scheme.
