

MEMORIAL BUILDING TO BE BUILT ON SITE OF JAMESTOWN CHURCH



The discovery of the old foundations of the church at Jamestown, their character, the need of protection to keep them from crumbling away, the erection of a temporary frame structure over them, the generous offer of the National Society of Colonial Dames to erect an attractive building and its acceptance by the A. P. V. A., are so well known that it is needless to go over the matter again.

The first plans for the Dames Memorial building were a gift to that society from Mr. S. H. Yonse, of this city, and the general idea will be adhered to. But the plans from which the building will be erected have been drawn by Mr. Edmund M. Wheelwright, of Boston, the distinguished architect, who is building the new Museum of Fine Arts for that city. Mr. Wheelwright also gives his services. He prepared himself

by visits to Jamestown and the old Smithfield Church, and by a careful study of each.

The new building will be of Gothic type, like the old, but modified by renaissance feeling. It will, of course, have buttresses and an open timber roof. Every detail has been most carefully studied, even down to the wrought nails and leaded window frames dug up in the church, and fine examples of hinges found in other buildings at Jamestown.

Like the tower and the buttresses of the old church, the brick of the new building will be laid in English bond, and bricks will be especially made to obtain the desired size and color. The great last window, which is copied from that at Smithfield, will be the thing of greatest interest.

The new building will be about 55 by 27 feet. The foundations of the 1617 church, the two tombs, and the old church festival near Winterham the night of April 14th.



Forest Lodge, Glen Allen, Va.

Glen Allen, Virginia, a picturesque spot on the Washington-Southern Railway, might easily be developed into a charming relay point for the accommodation of climatic travel.

More than forty motor cars has been bestowed on the natural beauties of this place, and it certainly unites more advantages as a midway resort than can be found at any other railroad point between the North and the South.

As in like Europe, is realizing that a sudden transition between extremes of temperature is not wholesome, and pleasant pausing places are being increasingly called for.

The postoffice, which is a central point for rural routes, is of the Presidential class, and has a foreign money order department. New York papers arrive before noon, and the nearby evening journals are on hand within the hour of their issue.

Many improvements are springing up around the property, such as mills and electric and attractive villas. Also, a pretty church, a graded school, a new station, an electric road, now building, and a publishing house which employs some fifty people.
