RUSH AID TO DIAMOND SHOALS LIGHTSHIP

(Special to The Times-Dispatch.) NORFOLK, Va., January 31.—Diamond Shoals Lightship, No. 72, was reported in distress by the cutter of the Gulf Shoal Life-Saving Station, which is fifteen miles north of Cape Fear, N. C. The vessel was signaling for assistance.

No. 72 has just been relieved at the Diamond Shoal station by No. 71, a former vessel having been on the station since about December 1st. No. 72 was reported to Baltimore when she got into trouble.

The vessel was reported over the southeast wire of the United States Weather Bureau. The nature of the mishap that may have befallen her was not known.

The report from the vessel was transmitted to the buoy department of the navy, which sent aid to the vessel.

The vessel and crew are not supposed to be in great danger, although a north gale was blowing from the north, and the sea was moderately rough when the report came in. No. 72 is a two-masted schooner-rigged vessel.
