

JOHN BROCKWELL DIES OF POISON

Man Who Took Carbolic Acid Succumbs—Once Prominent Farmer of Prince George.

LOSES ARM AND LEG

W. H. Vaughan, Who Was Crushed Between Cars, Stands Severe Operation Well.

[Special to The Times-Dispatch.] PETERSBURG, VA., March 15.—Mr. John Brockwell died about 4 o'clock this morning at his residence on Jones Street from the effects of carbolic acid, which he is believed by some to have swallowed with the purpose of committing suicide, though the fact that he had been using carbolic acid of the acid externally suggests the possibility of his having taken the poison by mistake. Mr. Brockwell, who was formerly a prosperous farmer in Prince George county, had come to Petersburg, Va., and came to live in this city, where he was employed in a factory. He is survived by his wife and three children.

Stands Operation Well.

W. H. Vaughan, the young man who fell beneath a moving train on the Norfolk and Western Railroad near Waverly yesterday morning, was operated upon at the Home for the Sick here last night by Dr. J. M. Burke, one of the Norfolk hospital surgeons, assisted by Dr. John Mann, of this city, and Dr. H. Aulick Burke, of Richmond. Mr. Vaughan's right arm and right leg were so seriously crushed that the surgeons found it necessary to amputate the arm at the shoulder and the leg above the knee. He stood the operation well and his condition to-day is favorable. The injured man is a son of Judge William R. Vaughan, of St. Louis, who came here from Norfolk, and is with his son.

ASK ANDY'S AID

Steel King May Help Build School at Culpeper.

[Special to The Times-Dispatch.] CULPEPER, VA., March 25.—This city has now the very best opportunity it has yet had to secure the additional school in the great Randolph-Macon system of educational institutions. Chancellor W. W. Smith has had handsome drawings of the proposed school buildings prepared. Dr. Smith, who has also forwarded to Mr. Andrew Carnegie a petition, accompanied by a resolution of the Culpeper Town Council, asking for financial aid in the matter.

Some time since the location for the school buildings was generously donated by two enterprising citizens of Culpeper—Messrs. S. R. Smith and E. H. Jones—which is a most excellent place a half mile south of town, on both the Southern and Chesapeake and Ohio Railroads. Chancellor Smith, who was lately in this city, expressed himself as being well satisfied with the progress so far in the establishment of the academy for young ladies.

BORING FOR OIL.

C. & O. Conducting Experiment at Clifton Forge.

[Special to The Times-Dispatch.] CLIFTON FORGE, VA., March 25.—A matter of interest to the people of this section is the fact that Mr. Peter Tomer, of Kansas, has his machinery at work in this city boring for oil on the property of the Chesapeake and Ohio Railway adjoining the shops of the said company. Mr. Tomer is an expert oil man. Near the point where the well is being bored oil has been oozing out of the ground for a long time. It was claimed that this oil came from a vein at Clifton Forge, which was disproved in two ways, viz: That there are no leaks to the oil house, and a sample of the oil has been declared to be crude oil by the experts in the Department of Agriculture at Washington. The well at present is upwards of 200 feet deep, but so far there have been no indications of oil. Mr. Scholmer will bore other wells in this vicinity, even if he does not strike oil at the scene of his present operations.

WORK ON COUNTY ROADS.

Discuss Plan to Keep Two Large Forces at Work.

[Special to The Times-Dispatch.] CHRISTEFIELD C. H., Va., March 25.—The Chesterfield supervisors today, at their monthly meeting, took up the matter of combining the six district road funds and organizing and equipping an auxiliary road force, transferable from one part of the county to another, so that two large road forces may be kept continuously at work at different parts of the county the year round. This combination of action has been found necessary in view of the scarcity of labor, the difficulty of working singly, not being able to keep forces constantly employed, and therefore not being able frequently to pick up hands at times when the demand for road work is urgent. The matter was continued over until the 2d day of April, when a special meeting will be held for definite plans to be decided upon.
