FREIGHT WRECK ON THE SOUTHERN

Engine and Eleven Cars Are Derailed Near Witten Station.

TWO EMPLOYEES INJURED

Engineer Had Leg Broken and Fireman Has Arm Broken and Head Injured.

(Special to The Times-Dispatch.) DANVILLE, VA., March 31.—Southern Railway train No. 71, a southbound freight, was wrecked at about 2 o'clock this morning at Witten, about seven miles north of here, resulting in the injury to two persons and the derailment of the engine and eleven cars.

The accident was caused by the right back connection rod becoming disconnected, and damaging the running-board and axle box, which became bent and gouged the road bed.


