

AUDITOR ANDREWS BRINGS GREETINGS

Admirable Address Delivered Before North Carolina Bankers by Nebraskan.

GET OTHER FELLOW'S MONEY

This Was Real Demand of the Times, Humorously Said Mr. Samuel R. Smith.

[Special to The Times-Dispatch.] WINSTON, N. C., May 24.—The features of the closing session of the North Carolina Bankers' Convention here to-day were addressed by Auditor W. E. Andrews, of the Treasury Department, Washington, D. C., and by Samuel R. Smith, head of nine banks in New York State. Mr. Andrews extended greetings from Washington and the national treasury. He also brought congratulations and good wishes from Secretary Cortright, of the Treasury Department. Mr. Andrews made kind references to North Carolina, and he produced cheers when he said that even Joseph G. Cannon had to come to North Carolina to be born to help President Roosevelt run the last Congress.

He discussed entertainingly financial policies and problems. He gave facts and figures, but they were presented in a voice that captured and held the close attention of every hearer.

He said the national treasury must lead the way in protecting the interests of the country. "Do not get frightened when I say nation, because I'm from Nebraska," said the speaker. Mr. Andrews believes in a free and earnest discussion of all questions. He thought the bankers and commercial interests generally should acquaint themselves regarding the relations of the government to the United States treasury and the treasury to the government.

"Co-operation." "Co-operation vs. Coercion." Very humorously did the speaker remind his hearers that the real great demand of the times was to secure the other fellow's money. Mr. Smith argued in behalf of co-operation instead of coercion in all business and social relations. Mr. Smith pleaded for fairer treatment for the railroads. He stood for better service, but wanted to remind the people of the benefits being derived from the railroads. He believed in high ideals for individuals and for governments.

W. T. Old, of Elizabeth City, was elected president of the association; I. W. Jackson, of Raleigh; G. W. Maslin, of Waynesville, and John O. Ellington, of Fayetteville, vice-presidents; W. A. Hunt, of Henderson, was re-elected secretary and treasurer. Mr. Hunt's salary was increased \$100. Delegates to convention of American Bankers' Association—Thomas Maslin, Winston-Salem; J. B. Mason, Durham; Julian H. Little, Charlotte; John H. Carter, Asheville; J. C. Braswell, Rocky Mount.


