WANT WAGES EVERY FORTNIGHT

The... greatly exaggerated reports have gone out from here as to a so-called strike of small proportions, which is on at the state quarries at this place. The trouble here originated because several of the companies jointly passed resolutions to pay their men monthly instead of fortnightly, as they had been doing for the past year. Formerly all wages and salaries were paid monthly, and the change to bi-weekly was made by the company without being asked to do so. It was tried as an experiment by the company and was at length found to be unsatisfactory.

PENNSYLVANIANS UNVEIL MARKER

Granite Slab Designates Farthest Point Reached in Confederate Lines. [Special to The Times-Dispatch.] PETERSBURG, Va., July 30.—The unveiling of a marker at the Crater this morning by members of the Survivors' Association, Second Pennsylvania Veteran Heavy Artillery, signified the forty-third anniversary of the great night of July 30, 1864, when that regiment led the charge into the Crater immediately after the explosion with 780 officers and men, and came out with 288, losing 494 in killed and wounded, including eight officers. The marker, which is a massive granite slab about five feet high, inscribed with the name of the regiment and a brief summary of its part in the battle, is placed well within the Confederate line, about forty yards from the pit marking the scene of the explosion that blew up the Confederate battery at the point known as "Pillott's Salient."

The veterans of the Second Pennsylvania state that the regiment advanced one hundred and fifty yards beyond the Crater, the marker being located where it returned after falling back, decimated by the storm of shot and shell.

TRUCKS TAKE PLACE OF "OLD JOHN BROWN" RAILS

[Special to The Times-Dispatch.] WINCHESTER, Va., July 30.—The large force of men engaged in the work of laying the new 85-pound rails on the Shenandoah Valley Division of the Baltimore and Ohio Railroad between Harper's Ferry and Winchester, a distance of thirty-two miles, is now about half a mile north of this city, and the undertaking, it is expected, will be completed by the first of next week. The new rails take the place of the "Old John Brown" rails, which were laid many years ago.


