

CLARKSON IN LONDON; GIRL NOT WITH HIM

Young Woman Reported to Have Gone to Paris to Join Her Father.

NO ONE KNOWS WHERE SHE WENT

Englishman Won't Talk, but Elopers Said to Have Parted Until Former Marriage Is Annulled—Denies His Identity.

NEW YORK, November 2.—The American to-day prints a special cablegram from London, which says: Samuel Clarkson, whose elopement a month ago with Miss Helen Maloney, daughter of Martin Maloney, the paper magnate of Philadelphia, stirred up two continents, has created another sensation by returning to London without the young woman and settling down to his former dissipated life in lodgings near his club in Piccadilly.

It is suggested here that Miss Maloney may have returned to her father, who, with her sister, is in Paris. Clarkson told some friends that he had been in Paris since his return from America. This is the extent of the information he has given to any one since his return. He absolutely refuses to discuss the matter in any form.

Flees From An Interview. The American correspondent traced Clarkson to one of the theatres here to-night, and after the performance attempted to interview him. But at the moment of his name Clarkson seized the arm of the reporter, who with him and rushed out of the lobby and entered a cab.

Another significant fact is that Clarkson has not been seen in company with any of his friends of the Maloney who just after the elopement. Finally, he declines absolutely to discuss the affair, even with his most intimate friends.

The impression is growing here that a separation has been agreed upon between the young woman and Clarkson, possibly by agreement, to continue until the matter of the previous marriage of Miss Maloney has been satisfactorily straightened out.


