



WASHINGTON, D. C., November 4.—Originating in a magistrate's court in Chesterfield county, S. C., and involving a dispute over a claim for \$175, the case of the Seaboard Air Line Railway vs. Seegers...

Justice Brewer said: It is not leveled against corporations alone, but against all common carriers. The classification is based upon the nature of the business, that business being a public character.

While in this case the penalty may be large compared with the value of the shipment, yet it must be remembered that small shippers are the ones who especially need the protection of penal statutes like this.
