## BECK TO EXAMINE CAPITOL BUILDING

### Will Report to Commission, and Repairs Will Be Ordered if Necessary.

In order to determine once for all whether the Capitol building is in an unsafe condition the commission appointed to construct the new annex to the State Library will go over the situation carefully with City Building Inspector Henry P. Beck at its meetings on Monday, and will direct him to make a complete report concerning the matter.

## IN DILEMMA OVER CITY STREET SIGNS

For nearly an hour last night the Board of Aldermen tried to get at the inwardness of the street sign measure, City Clerk August being called on to read the records bearing on this matter for a period of two years. The matter came up on concurrence, with a resolution passed by the Common Council giving a special committee on street signs the power to close a contract. Alderman Renolds wished to know why the committee wanted this additional authority, saying that the original resolution creating the special committee on street signs, which, by the way, passed December 3, 1906, had instructed the committee to secure bids and report back their recommendation. Councilman Whitshire, chairman of the committee, explained that under a later act than the one creating the special committee, \$3,000 had been appropriated and the question was raised as to whether the committee as originally provided for had not died with the old Council.

The Governor was accompanied by his secretary, Mr. Ben P. Owen, Jr. They returned to the city last night, and will be in the executive office this morning.
