

ALEXANDRIA MAN SHOOT A BURGLAR

Philip Rush Sends Two Bullets Crashing Through Thief's Head.

ALEXANDRIA, VA., November 6.—Finding a stranger in his bed room shortly before 1 o'clock this morning, Philip Rush, who was aroused by his wife, fired four shots at the intruder as he sprang from a closet. Two bullets went through the burglar's head. He is in a dying condition at the Alexandria Hospital.

The unknown, who is thirty-five years old, refuses to give his name or tell anything concerning himself. It is believed his name is William O'Brien. He was released on his recognizance.

O'Brien came here from Fredericksburg, and has been living here for several years past. It is said he has a wife and family in Fredericksburg. About ten days ago he was arrested by the local authorities on suspicion of robbing a house in Washington, where he was placing lightning rods. The woman who was the complainant could not positively identify O'Brien, and he was released.

THE VIRGINIAN RAILWAY INCREASES ITS STOCK TO \$30,000,000
NORFOLK, VA., November 6.—At a meeting of the stockholders of the Virginia Railway, held at the general offices of the company in this city to-day, the common stock was increased from \$25,000,000 to \$30,000,000. The only announcement made concerning this action was that the increase of stock by \$5,000,000 was for "corporate purposes." H. H. Rogers, the reputed owner of the Virginia, was not in attendance, all of the larger stockholders being represented by proxy.

News of Petersburg

Petersburg, Va., November 6.—
The new industrial building just completed at the Virginia Normal and Industrial Institute, near this city, was dedicated this afternoon with interesting ceremonies. It was named the "Vawter Building," in commemoration of the name and memory of the late Professor Charles E. Vawter, the distinguished educator, who was for years closely associated with the Virginia Normal and Industrial Institute as a member of its board of visitors, and who was in large measure the patron of the industrial system of education, so successfully established at this institute, which is proving a blessing to the colored race. The popularity and value of the industrial training taught here is best evidenced by the growing and crowded attendance of students of both sexes, the number this session being 550. The new Vawter Building will greatly relieve the pressure for rooms and accommodations. It will furnish apartments for a new industry just established—that of making and handling large quantities of an entire floor of the large building will be used as an industrial school and the top floor for dormitories for apprentices for girls of the advanced classes. There are forty-three of these rooms. The dairy business and the making of cheese and other products, together with instruction in farming generally, the care of stock, etc., will be under the direct care of Mr. T. O. Saunders, with instruction in the successful management of farms.

It was a matter of regret that neither Governor Swanson nor Superintendent of Public Instruction Engleston could be present. Their engagements were such as to prevent them from participating in the ceremony.

Addresses were delivered by Dr. B. M. Davis, of Richmond, and Judge Asa G. Parsons, of Farmville, of the board of visitors; Mr. T. O. Saunders and others.

The Police Department.
The Police Commissioners will have a public inspection of the police corps at noon on Monday, and have directed the purchase of new winter uniforms for the officers and members. It is understood that the commissioners will ask the Common Council to increase the number of the corps to 150, the addition of six men, to establish a patrol system in the city, to purchase uniform and standard arms for the men and to provide other measures to increase the efficiency of the corps. These things will all be asked for at the beginning of the next fiscal year. The Petersburg police corps consists of only twenty-eight officers and privates. It is compact and very fit body of men, but entirely too small

CORONER'S JURY CHARGES NEGRO PREACHER WITH MURDER

SUFFOLK, VA., November 6.—At the third adjourned session of the coroner's jury, which has been investigating the death of Rev. James L. Smith, colored, who had been mysteriously missing from his flock at Redd's Ferry, Va., since August, a verdict was brought in at 6 o'clock this evening deciding that Smith had come to his death from the effects of a blow from a blunt instrument in the hands of Rev. Ernest Lyons, also colored, who already is in custody, and who was returned to jail. Both preachers were followers of the "Sanctified" sect, and Lyons is alleged to have displaced Smith by killing him in order that he could secure the pastorate, which he did.

Lyons explained the absence of Smith from his charge by giving several alleged reasons—that his father was ill in Wilson, N. C.; that he had come off to get married; that he had trouble about a female member of his flock; that he could not raise \$40 conference dues, and that he was conducting a revival in Newport News.

Contract Let for Harrisonburg Normal School Buildings

HARRISONBURG, VA., November 6.—The board of trustees of the State Normal and Industrial School for Women met here last night and awarded the contract for building a science hall and a dormitory. The contract was awarded to William M. Bucher & Son at the price of \$38,695. The contract calls for the completion of the dormitory not later than August 15, 1909, and the science hall at a later date than September 1, 1909, so that the school will be ready to open September 15th. The site was purchased a few months ago for \$19,000.
