

MANY TEAMS FALL OUT OF THE RACE

Eighteen Out of Twenty-seven Remain in the Go-as-You-Please.

NEW YORK, March 8.—But eighteen of the twenty-seven teams which started at 12:30 A. M. today in the six-day go-as-you-please race in Madison Square Garden were left in the race at the end of the twentieth hour to-night. Dineen and Prouty, the Boston team, which practically set the pace at the start, were holding the lead.

Christie, of the West Side; Higgins, of the Canadians; and the two Greek teams, during the afternoon found the going too strenuous and quit, and Ferris, of the Italians, also fell by the wayside. Hartley, of the Canadian team, roused up with Ward, of the West Side, but the latter soon was run into the ground and dropped out, and Hartley came his lot with Fallent, the Italian, taking the place of Ferris.

Dineen and Prouty still led with 145 miles 9 laps to their credit, but Chiot and Orpheus, Frenchmen, had replaced Spring and Adams in second place. These three teams at 8 o'clock were well in the van of the others and rubbing smoothly.

At 8 o'clock the ten leading teams were: Dineen and Prouty, 145.9; Chiot and Orpheus, 143.2; Spring and Adams, 142.5; Feegan and Curtis, 129.6; Davis and Metkus, 127.9; Navez and Gomas, 126.4; Hoeslein and Klunbertanz, 122.1; Heggelman and Golden, 120.4; Corey and Coleman, 118.2; Gulnard and Rovere, 116.3.

At 10:30—Easford, the Englishman, and Endlich, of the military team, quit and their partners, Wollidge and Searns, immediately picked up the team. Leaves seventeen teams in the race.

Frenchmen Now Lead. After having gamely struggled all the afternoon to catch Dineen and Prouty, the Boston team, Chiot and Orpheus, the Frenchmen, in the six-day go-as-you-please race, at Madison Square Garden, by a wonderful burst of speed, Louis Orpheus, of the French team, took a lead of two laps over the Americans shortly after midnight.

All records for the twenty-four hours were left by the board ten minutes before midnight, when Dineen had covered 155 miles and one lap, and exactly on the stroke of midnight the French team equaled the figures set by Heggelman and Cavanaugh, when they made the record in 1907.

With seven laps between him and the Frenchman, Dineen plugged methodically along, but Orpheus then began to outpace him. Suddenly the Frenchman opened with a wonderful burst of speed and circled around and around the track amid the plaudits of the spectators, gradually creeping up on the American. Dineen pressed forward gamely, but the Frenchman would not be denied, and at 12:30 he passed the Boston runner, and then circled the track again and again until he obtained an advantage of two laps over him.
