

CORPORATIONS AND TAX THEY PAY. Annual Report of State Commission—Railway and Bank Figures.

As the result of the work of the State Corporation Commission, the sum of \$1,112,639.48 was paid into the State treasury during the year 1908.

Other Taxation. The State's telegraph, telephone, steamboat, express and sleeping car companies paid a total ad valorem license and income tax of \$69,110.03 upon an assessed valuation of \$3,775,859.46, an increase of \$15,905.21 in taxes over the year 1907.
