WEEK'S TOBACCO SALES HAVE BEEN VERY LIGHT

Weather Unfavorable for Marketing Throughout Virginia and the Carolinas--Little More Than Primings Offered.

The weather for the past week in all parts of the tobacco-growing sections of Virginia and the Carolinas has been unfavorable for the handling of the weed, and as a natural result sales of the leaf have been rather small in all of the markets.

In Richmond the offerings consisted almost entirely of primings of the sun-cured variety, and very little was sold at that. In all of the four warehouses sold on Friday, the only sales day of the week, these primings sold fairly well, ranging from \$1.50 per 100 up to \$5.

There will probably be no sales at the warehouses this week, as all of the farmers who market the leaf here, as well as the warehousemen, will be attending the State Fair. But after this week the market will open up in earnest and sales will likely grow from that date on until the sun-dried and the Burley crops shall have been marketed.

The Danville Market. (Special to The Times-Dispatch.) DANVILLE, Va., October 2.—The sales of loose tobacco at the warehouses have lasted about an average of two hours a day this week. The offerings have been of the stalk-cured stock, with practically no primings.

WALL STREET GOSSIP

(Special to The Times-Dispatch.) NEW YORK, October 2.—Operations on the Stock Exchange today were conducted in a very cautious manner for the reason that traders were very uncertain as to what they should expect from the forthcoming bank statement.

The most pessimistic predictions were made, some of which even went so far as to predict the destruction of the surplus reserve.

When the figures were actually issued the showing was undeniably worse than last week, but on the other hand were so much better than had been expected that sentiment was apparently everywhere much helped by its publication.

American Sugar Refining is perhaps the typical instance of a thoroughly "taken" corporation, so that the results of a stockholder's investigation brought to determine whether or not there was any element of truth in charges frequently brought against this organization, may also be taken as revealing the "real condition" of the long list of "trunks exposed" by the immediate excitement of the inquiry was an article appearing in a monthly magazine, whose editorial board is likewise the proprietor of a long string of sensational newspapers.

In this article it was charged that the company had netted out some \$7,000,000 in "losses," and that the item stood thus on the books with no explanation.

The investigators found that the muckraker had mistaken the word "loans" for "loans" in some accountant's handwriting, and otherwise seemed unaware of the credit side of the ledger from the debit. Incidentally, it was also found that all investments are conservatively valued; that the book value of the company's stock has been heavily scaled down, and that beyond its capitalization of \$7,000,000 the company has no debts or liabilities of any kind.
