REPUBLICANS FAIL TO GAIN IN VIRGINIA

Vote for Two State Officers Shows That Democrats Have Secured Normal Majority--Count Others in January.

J. D. Eggleston, Jr. is elected Superintendent of Public Instruction by a majority of approximately 3,400 over Frank P. Brent, his Republican opponent.

The total vote returned for the office of Superintendent of Public Instruction is 99,981, and that for Commissioner of Agriculture is 109,367.

Probably 11,000 votes were cast in the missing counties, making the total vote in the State on these two offices about 111,000.

The official returns from all of the counties and from eighty-nine of the 100 counties have been received at the office of the Secretary of the Commonwealth, and those for Secretary of Agriculture and for Superintendent of Public Instruction were opened yesterday.

The missing counties are Accomac, Alleghany, Caroline, Charlotte, Fluvanna, Lancaster, Mecklenburg, Northumberland, Roanoke, Rockbridge and Wise.

Big Democratic Majorities. These returns give Mr. Eggleston a total vote of 61,949 and Mr. Brent a total vote of 37,740.
