

New York Stock Market

NEW YORK, November 15.—The upturn of prices of stocks in to-day's market had its origin in the greatly strengthened position of the banks, disclosed by the bank statement on Saturday, and in the corroborative evidence of the rumors of a coming combination embracing most of the world's great producers and sellers of that metal. The action of the copper securities was in itself strongly confirmatory of these rumors.

Not detailed information could be secured of the plan in contemplation of a new corporation, and that it aimed to bring within its scope the great foreign copper producers, as well as those in this country, was the current assumption.

The general market was not at first inclined to follow the lead of the copper securities with an enthusiasm. The day's market in fact was spotty throughout. Sentiment was more tranquil over the cotton, and a temporary break in American Sugar was accepted as an episode connected with the activity of the public prosecuting officials.

Bonds were irregular. Total sales, par value, \$3,198,000. United States bonds were unchanged and total sales to-day were \$56,500 shares.
