New York, March 22.—Holding the local record as bigamist and heart-breaker, Arthur Zimmerman, bogus member of the German nobility, yesterday was sentenced to Sing Sing prison by Judge Dike, in the County Court, Brooklyn.

him a list of two dozen marriages he contracted in this country and Germany. The "count" was much affected by these memories. He tugged at his mustache, stroked his beard, and seemed at times about to weep, as he thought of the score and more of wives he had deserted, not to mention the nineteen children and the two dozen broken homes.

All a Matter of Temperament. "I have been misunderstood," said he, with a melancholy note in his voice. "I thought each was the affinity my heart hungered for, but I was mistaken. I never found her. I am discouraged, but I am not without hope. In jail this morning I heard a prisoner sing 'Somebody in the world there's a little girl for me,' and I cheered me greatly."

Judge Dike sentenced him to serve from four years and eight months to nine years and six months. Zimmerman's attorney came through his marriage to Mrs. Hahl. Finding that he had made another soul mate mistake he deserted the woman, but she learned through a letter that he was married to a Mrs. Emilie Grohman, 150 of Brooklyn.

Eleven Wives in One Year. The "Count's" scheme, it is alleged, was to marry women, get from them whatever money and property he could and then desert them. His most prosperous year in the matrimonial line seems to have been 1878, when he married eleven times. Zimmerman is now fifty-nine years old.

HAT PINS TO STAY. No Law Against Them in District, Says Sylvester.

Washington, March 22.—Washington women can jab hold-up men and mashers with long hat pins all they want and no one in Congress will rise up and cry "Outrage!" according to Major Sylvester, superintendent of police of the District of Columbia.


