

GOVERNOR NAMES PELL FOR JUDGE

Appointee Will Not Be Candidate Before Judicial Convention.

[Special to The Times-Dispatch.] Raleigh, N. C., April 15.—George P. Pell, of Winston-Salem, is appointed by Governor Kitchin as judge of the Eleventh Judicial District to succeed E. B. Jones, resigned. The following official statement was issued from the executive office this afternoon:

"The Governor has announced that after careful consideration of the situation in the Eleventh Judicial District, he has decided to appoint Hon. George P. Pell judge to fill the unexpired term of Judge E. B. Jones, resigned. The Governor is aware of the fact that Mr. Pell is not a candidate, and will not be a candidate before the convention."

These in touch with the situation here point out that in making this appointment of a man who is not in the contest for convention nomination, Governor Kitchin is following a precedent set by Governor Fowle, when in 1896 he appointed Judge McCorkle to fill out the unexpired term of Judge Shipps, deceased, when Judge Hoke, Judge Justice and J. J. Vann were candidates before the convention.

It was understood at that time, as it is in the case of Mr. Pell, that he would not be a candidate before the convention.

The action of Governor Kitchin leaves the field clear for J. C. Buxton, C. O. McMichael, W. P. Carter, Porter Graves, and others to fight out the matter of the judicial nomination in the Eleventh District convention without either of them getting the advantage that the appointment of either at this time would give.

George P. Pell, who is to succeed Judge Jones, has recently gotten out Pell's "Annotated Code of North Carolina," that is pronounced by judges and practitioners of the law generally to be especially valuable, and this appointment by Governor Kitchin is regarded as a fitting recognition of this service.
