DR. LATANE KILLED IN AUTO ACCIDENT

Heavy Machine Plunges Over Embankment, Crushing Him in Death.

WAS ANSWERING SICK CALL

Dead Man Was Leading Physician and Secretary Board to Death.

(Special to The Times-Dispatch.) Winchester, Va., May 2.—The body of Dr. Samuel Peachy Latane, one of the most prominent physicians and surgeons of the Valley of Virginia, who was killed in a fatal auto accident here, was brought to the home of his father-in-law, Dr. William H. Love, here, this morning. The funeral will take place from the Presbyterian Church Wednesday afternoon, and the interment will be in Mount Hope cemetery.

Dr. Latane was a member of the late Captain William Latane, who figured in a daring episode during the Civil War. Captain Latane organized the Essex Light Dragoons, which were attached to General J. E. B. Stuart's Brigade. In July, 1862, he led the men in a raid around McClellan's rear, on the Pamunkey River, and was the only man killed. His brother, Lieutenant John Latane, carried his body from the field through the lines of the Federal army to the Brockenborough plantation, in Hanover county, where it was prepared by the women for burial. The Episcopal service was read by Mrs. Brockenborough, and the body was buried by the women on the plantation. John R. Thompson, an intimate friend of Captain Latane, wrote a poem, "The Burial of Latane," which was pronounced by Tennyson one of the most beautiful and touching contributions to English literature he had ever read. A painting depicting the scene was made by the celebrated artist, Washington, and sent all over the world.

MAN WITNESSED MURDER. Hale Properly Sentenced for Killing of Lillie Davis. (Special to The Times-Dispatch.) Bristol, Va., May 2.—The first evidence that there were eye-witnesses to the murder of Lillie Davis, the pretty Bristol girl, who was shot to death in East Hill cemetery here three years ago, has come to light in the form of a communication from Postmaster J. C. Shafter, of Portage, Pa. He has written the postmaster here in response to a letter written a year ago, to the effect that a Mr. Boland, of the same town, witnessed the cemetery murder. Mr. Boland related, according to this letter, that he and a companion had gone from the hotel at the cemetery early in the evening, and were in conversation there when Hale and Lillie Davis entered the cemetery. He heard a quarrel, but had been so attentive out of curiosity. It was only a little while until Hale fired the fatal shot and ran away from the scene. Boland was absent at the time for the reason that he did not care to in any way be associated with such an affair so far from home. He is quoted as saying, however, that had he been summoned he would have appeared to tell his story at the trial of Hale.

Postmaster Shafter expresses the view that the jury was very correct in its judgment in giving Hale a life sentence to the penitentiary, even if there had been no person to testify to having witnessed the killing.

MAY NAME FULL TICKET. Republicans Think There is a Chance to Capture Tennessee. (Special to The Times-Dispatch.)
