

Board Presents Estimate of Cost for Equipping South Richmond.

FAVORS AN AUTO ENGINE

Also Asks Underground Cable for Fire Alarm Boxes to City Hall.

The Board of Fire Commissioners presented to the Common Council last night a schedule of the cost of giving adequate fire protection to Washington Ward as guaranteed in the ordinance for the annexation of Manchester, asking a special appropriation for the purchase of a new site and erection of a proper building for an engine house, to cost \$14,000, and the purchase of a new automobile engine and equipment at a cost of \$12,300.
