value of products brought into existence by the average farm worker in the South. The teaching of elementary agriculture in the public schools is already aiding this rural enrichment. Parents read and occasionally put into practice, with profit, some new idea or recommendation read in their children's agricultural text book. For example, the successful introduction of crimson clover into the cotton States is being hastened by the instruction of the children in the story of how this and other plants appropriate for use the nitrogen of the air, and convert this into fertilizer for the enrichment of the soil; it is being hastened by the fairy story that the children are repeating of how certain germs must be brought into the clover field for this special work.

The leavening effects of the boys corn clubs in increasing the yield of corn on the patches worked by the boys, and also in stimulating parents to produce better corn crops, is an example of how the child's agricultural instruction helps to improve the parent's practice.

Instruction in agriculture causes a larger proportion of the brightest boys to remain on the farm. This is because it points out the possibilities of larger profits than have prevailed. It is also because such teaching arouses the boy's interest and thought about the common plants and animals, and processes of the farm.

High educational value. The teaching of agriculture has a high educational value, especially in training the pupil to habits of observation. It relates education to life. It cultivates the seeing eye, the spirit of inquiry, the thirst for more complete knowledge of nature.

The teaching of agriculture must at present be done chiefly by those who have had no training or experience in farming. Hence, the teacher should have the following immediate aims in mind: To teach the general underlying principles, rather than the mere details of farming; to let patrons know that their help is needed, and that they will be depended on to supply to their children the practical instruction needed, while the school room teaches the principles.

The other speaker at the afternoon conference was Mrs. Neale S. Knowles of the extension department, Iowa State College, who had for her topic, "Domestic Science in Rural Districts." To-night in Cabell Hall J. D. Eggleston, Jr., State Superintendent of Education, addressed a large audience on "Good Roads and Good Schools."

WILL NOT BE COUNTED.

New Census Will Not Include Norfolk's Annex Territory.

[Special to The Times-Dispatch.]

Norfolk, Va., July 13.—Although Huntersville and Lambert's Point, with their 15,000 persons, are immediately annexed, they will not be included in the 1911 census of the city by the government. Such is the decision of Director Durand, of the Census Bureau.

Following the final decision of the city of Norfolk to annex the two outlying territories, Director Durand was communicated with by the local business bodies, and asked if he would hold up the census of the city and include the suburbs. This he declined to do yesterday, declaring that only such territory as belonged to the city on April 15 would be included.

However, the city officials will begin the legal work of annexation at once. The county authorities will interpose no objection to the annexation of Huntersville, admitting that it properly belongs to the city, but will oppose the taking in of Lambert's Point.
